

PE and Sport Premium Grant (SPG) expenditure: Report to Parents: 2015/16



Overview of the school

Nature of planned support 2015/2016

The school is building a sustainable model for the future through the acquisition of additional physical resources, staff training and the use of specialist providers. We aim to offer a wider range of quality physical activities to increase participation and levels of performance, both inside and outside the school day. Additional competitive and non competitive sporting opportunities are to be developed.

To achieve this, the following areas have been identified and an Action Plan formulated:

- *Professional development of staff*
- *External support and coaching within the PE and Healthy Lifestyles curriculum*
- *External providers for Sports Extra Curricular Clubs*
- *Additional sports equipment and resources*
- *Transport to sporting events*

Financial resources have been allocated to each of these areas.

Measuring the impact of SPG spending

The impact will be measured through:-

- *attainment in physical education*
- *participation and success in sports' tournaments and to take pride in their performance when representing the school.*
- *increased participation levels in sporting extra curricular activities*
- *children's attitudes towards PE*
- *increased staff confidence in the delivery of PE.*

A review of the impact of the funding will be undertaken at the end of the school year in July 2016.

Impact of SPG spending

The impact of the SPG was as follows:-

<i>Equipment/ Resources</i>	<i>£4484.12</i>	<i>Improved provision and equipment for the children to use. This engaged the children more in lessons and enabled children to use equipment that isn't readily available beyond school.</i>
<i>CPD</i>	<i>£200</i>	<i>AM and JM underwent subject leaders training, which enabled them to lead PE more effectively across the school.</i>
<i>Supply cover for CPD</i>	<i>£51</i>	<i>Supply cover enabled staff to be released to receive training on how to lead PE effectively across the school.</i>

<p><i>Curriculum Support from Outside Providers</i></p>	<p>£1815</p>	<p><i>The life caravan visited the school to educate the children on leading healthy active lifestyles. This engaged the children as they were learning in a different environment.</i></p> <p><i>The Coventry Sports Foundation provided some opportunities for our more able children to be pushed further and given a wider variety of opportunities.</i></p>
<p><i>External Providers for Extra Curricular Clubs</i></p>	<p>£500</p>	<p><i>We were able to offer a wider variety of sports for children after school so that they have more opportunities to try new things. This helped to engage children in sporting activities after school.</i></p>
<p><i>Transport</i></p>	<p>£70</p>	<p><i>Providing coaches made sports tournaments more accessible to the children and enabled them to put their skills to the test in a competitive environment. Our results at tournaments did improve.</i></p>
