Nature of support 2015/16 On-going development of a multi-professional 'Closing the Gaps' team to support teachers to maximise pupil attainment and progress through: small group and 1:1 curricular support preferable pupil / teacher ratio with Quality first teaching

- preferable pupil/ teacher ratio with duality institeaching
- improving attendance and punctuality using a Family Learning Mentor
- provision of an Explorers' Group in KS1 (early intervention) (Nurture)
- supporting early speaking and listening skills (Wellcomm and Talk Boost)
- supporting social and emotional well-being- Emotional Therapy
- working with key families- CAF support staff
- Increasing parental involvement in their children's learning, for example Maths Evening and Fun for Fathers Robot Night
- Parent Puzzle training and delivery to some families.
- Money available to families for support with trips.

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2015/16

- Supporting pupils in Maths and English through 1:2 tuition.
- Individual and small group support for literacy and numeracy work in KS2.
- Individual and small group support to develop early speaking and listening skills
- Individual and small group work to support and develop emotional literacy.
- Subsidised extra-curricular activities
- Subsidised trips.

How the Impact of PPG spending will be measured

- Analysis of pupil attainment and progress via termly pupil progress meetings
- Evaluations of the impact specific interventions.
- Improvement in attendance and punctuality data.
- Levels of parental involvement in children's learning.
