

Nature of support 2013/2014 – Autumn and Spring Terms

Since the original funding was limited to two years, the school has decided that building a sustainable model for the future is vital as well as offering a wider range of physical activities to increase pupil participation and healthy lifestyles.

To achieve this, the following areas have been identified and an Action Plan formulated:

- Full audit of PE curriculum and resources
- Professional development of staff
- External support and coaching within the PE and Healthy Lifestyles curricula
- External providers for Sports Extra Curricular Clubs
- Additional sports equipment and resources
- Transport to sporting events





Curriculum focus of SPG spending 2013/2014 – Autumn and Spring Terms

School management time was allocated over the Autumn Term to undertake a full audit of the current Physical Education and Healthy Lifestyles provision and resources across the entire age range. Financial Resources were then allocated to each of the areas below:

- Professional Development of Staff
- External Support and Coaching within the PE Curriculum
- External Providers for Extra Curricular Clubs
- Additional Equipment and Resources
- Transport to Sporting Events

A carry forward from the financial 2013/2014 year of £4,000 has been credited to the 2014/2015 financial year to support Summer Term activities

Measuring the impact of SPG spending

Impact to date has been limited as quality time has been given to undertaking a full audit of the PE curriculum and the human and physical resources needed to ensure quality coverage, increase opportunities and to raise standards of performance.

- Resources bought to enhance the curriculum from September 2014 particularly for gymnastics
- Increased participation in Sports' Tournaments
- Hand eye co-ordination improved in KS2 through specialist tennis, cricket and archery coaching
