Nature of support 2015/16

- On-going development of a multi-professional 'Closing the Gaps' team to support teachers to maximise pupil attainment and progress through:
 - small group and 1:1 curricular support
 - preferable pupil / teacher ratio with 'quality first' teaching
 - improving attendance and punctuality using ACE / Family Learning Mentor
 - the provision of a lunchtime invitation club
 - supporting early speaking and listening skills (Wellcomm and Talk Boost)
 - supporting social and emotional wellbeing Emotional Therapy
 - working with key families CAF support staff
- Increasing parental involvement in their children's learning, e.g. Maths Evening and Fun for Fathers Robot Night
- Parent Puzzle training and delivery to some families
- Money available to families for support with trips

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2015/16

Before & After School Provision

Currently, approximately 42% of those children attending the after school learning centre are those in receipt of pupil premium funding. Overall 44% of pupil premium children attend the provision. In these cases teachers report that children are better prepared for the school day and are completing their homework on a regular basis which is leading to accelerated progress.

- > The total number of pupil premium children in the whole school was 122 children.
- > The total number of children accessing E.C.A was 128 children.
- > The total number of pupil premium children accessing E.C.A was 54 children.


Counselling and Nurture Provision

50% of the children that have attended the Nurture provision are children in receipt of pupil premium funding and class teachers report that these children are better able to access their learning and as a result make better progress.

How the Impact of PPG spending will be measured

The progress of the pupils in receipt of the pupil premium grant is closely monitored by the Literacy and Numeracy subject leaders and by the Senior Leadership Team on a termly basis and reported to school Governors. Interventions are put into place to accelerate the progress of those children deemed to be making less than expected progress.

Phonics Screen




The result of our phonics screen show an upward trend over the past three years.

End of KS2

There is a significant 'within school gap' across all subjects between our disadvantaged and non-disadvantaged children. The results for our pupil premium pupils have shown an upward trend at Goodyers End within Maths and Writing and these results closely align with the other Warwickshire schools. The gap is most significant within Reading therefore this is where we will target improving provision for reading, raising awareness of developing a love of reading and targeted interventions for specific children to ensure the gap begins to close.
