Let's put our children's safety first

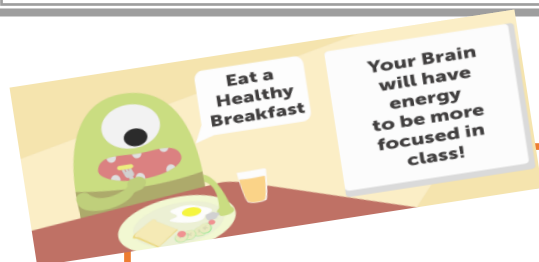
If you drive your children to school, it's too easy to try and park as near as possible to the school. However, when everyone does the same, it can cause major problems outside the entrance.
