

## Key Knowledge

The fire started in a baker's shop in Pudding Lane, London on Sunday 2nd September 1666. The fires for baking had not been put out properly. The fire spread quickly because building were made of wood and built close together. It was also very windy which helped the flames to spread. People used leather buckets of water to try to put it out. King Charles II ordered buildings to be pulled down to stop the fire spreading. Samuel Pepys write about it in his diary. Christopher Wren designed many of the buildings in London that were built after the fire.
