

## Nurturing Nurses

This nurturing nurses unit will teach children about the influential nurses Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. It asks children to establish what makes a person significant, explores and compares the lives and work of these nurses and considers how these individuals have influenced nursing today, making links to George Eliot hospital.

Key Vocabulary		
1	Nurture	Care for and protect (someone or something) while they are growing.
2	Significant	Sufficiently great or important to be worthy of attention; noteworthy
3	Crimean War	The <i>Crimean War</i> was fought between 1853 and 1856. It was fought in the <i>Crimea</i> , an area in the south of Russia at the time (now part of Ukraine). On one side were Britain, France, and Turkey, and on the other side was Russia.
4	Florence Nightingale	<i>Florence Nightingale</i> (12 May 1820 – 13 August 1910) was an English social reformer and the founder of modern nursing.
5	Scutari	Scutari was the Greek name for the district of Istanbul now known as Üsküdar (pronounced ewskewdar)
6	Government	The group of people with the authority to govern a country or state
7	Treason	The crime of betraying one's country.
8	Comparison	The similarities or dissimilarities between two things or people.
9	Remember	Be able to bring to one's mind an awareness of someone or something from the past.
10	Memorial	A statue or structure established to remind people of a person or event.
