Thursday Science	Find out what each letter in MRS GREN stands for. They are processes that all living things do. Create a poster which shows what the letters stand for. You could include pictures if you wish.  Are there any differences in the ways plants and animals carry out the life processes in MRS GREN?
Friday Science	Sort the following living things into the Venn diagram below:  Daffodil, fox, seaweed, worm, giraffe, grass, tiger, lobster, rabbit, daisy, shark.  Has legs  Lives on land,  Think where to put the living things that don't belong in either group.  Could you make your own Venn diagram using your own headings?  Can you find out what the words 'vertebrate' and 'invertebrate' mean.
