


Key Knowledge

- Identify George Elliot and Nicholas Chamberlaine and say why they are famous locally.




Maps of our Local Area.

L.S. Lowry

LS Lowry is one of Britain's most famous artists from the 19th Century. LS Lowry is well known for painting industrial scenes and matchstick characters. He drew the things he saw in daily life. He used pen, pencil, charcoal and pastels. There is an art gallery named after him in Manchester.

Paul Horton

Paul Horton lives in Birmingham. He takes inspiration from Lowry in his work by also drawing things he sees around him in daily life. His work is exhibited in the Birmingham Art Gallery.

George Elliot

George Elliot is a famous author who lived in Nuneaton. She was born in 1814 and her real name is Mary Ann Evans. She loved reading and write her own stories. She used the name George Elliot because she thought that people wouldn't want to read her stories if they knew they were written by a woman. Nicholas Chamberlaine

Nicholas Chamberlaine was born in 1622. He became a priest and moved to Bedworth where he was the parish rector. He also brought land in Bedworth. When he died he left money to build schools in Bedworth so that the children could learn and for the Alms Houses to be built for poor people of the town. We don't know what he looked like because there are no drawings or paintings of him. You can see the Alms Houses in Bedworth town centre.
